Mid Year Report
August 2010

1. Board Training

Since their appointment, the board have had three training sessions to understand the trustee role.

2. National Standards

Senior managers reported to the board recently on school wide achievement from Year 3 onwards, in Reading and Mathematics, in relation to the newly introduced National Standards.

We are over half way through the school year, and our students were assessed against the end of year standard. As can be seen below most students are making significant progress and are at or above the standard already.

School wide 67% at or above National Standard.

Our end of year data will be included in our 2010 Annual report to the Ministry of Education.

3. Room 15

Room 14 (Mrs Travers) will be full by the end of term 3. We do not have another classroom available, and the Ministry of Education will not provide another classroom due to the large number (30%) of out of zone students in our school. They will pay for the teacher, but not the room.

Room 15 will be in Multi Purpose 1 space, beside the library, from the start of term 4.

4. Enrolment Scheme

Our school will be overcrowded in term 4. At the end of the year we only have 33 year 8 leavers, so there will not be many spaces available.

The Board has decided to limit Out of Zone spaces in 2011 to siblings of current students only, except for Year 7 & 8, where 10 spaces are available.

5. Property

An upgrade of the toilet blocks in the Senior and Junior school has been completed. The interior of the Senior and Junior school has also been repainted. Cost \$87,883.

Other projects in our 5 Year Property Plan are:

- Filtration Upgrade at the Pool est. \$18,000 (October)
- Expansion of staffroom est. \$46,000 (Start Jan 2011)
