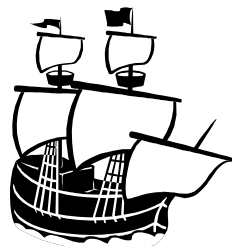

Congratulations to our Year 8 team who were placed 2nd. Thanks to Vicki Wijdeven for managing our team, and to Peter Cleary for refereeing.

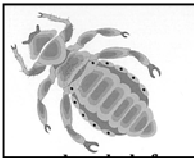

HEADLICE—CAN CATCH ANYONE



Headlice (kutu/utu) are tiny black or brown insects that live in the scalp. They lay their eggs (nits) close to the scalp, attaching them with a glue like substance. Headlice travel from head to head when heads are touching. Nits are a 'school community' problem and it takes effort from EVERY FAMILY to keep them under control.

Please do not think 'my child will never get headlice' - make a weekly routine to check each of your childrens' heads with a fine tooth comb. If you would like more information, please collect a Public Health brochure from the school office.
