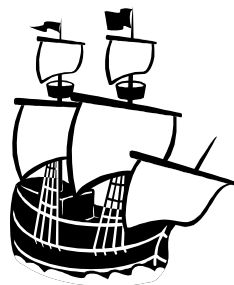

Each year at the Calf Club Review there is a discussion about how we can speed up the judging, particularly the lambs. It has been suggested a number of times that we have more than one 'leading' ring, but this is not practical for the way that our judging works. If we had another leading judge, then ALL the lambs who received a First ribbon for leading would need to do a LEAD OFF—as each judge would score the leading differently. As it is now, with the same judge doing all the leading, he is able to judge who is the best overall, from the scores that he has recorded on the sheets. It can be very difficult to ask the children (and the lambs) to do another lead at the end of the morning when everyone is getting weary. We hope parents can understand why we need to keep the processes unchanged.



If you have the misfortune to have an animal die and therefore will not be entering on Calf Club Day, please advise Mrs Wilson in the office as soon as possible.

We need some stewards to assist the judges in the lamb and calf rings. If you are able to assist please contact Lorraine asap.
