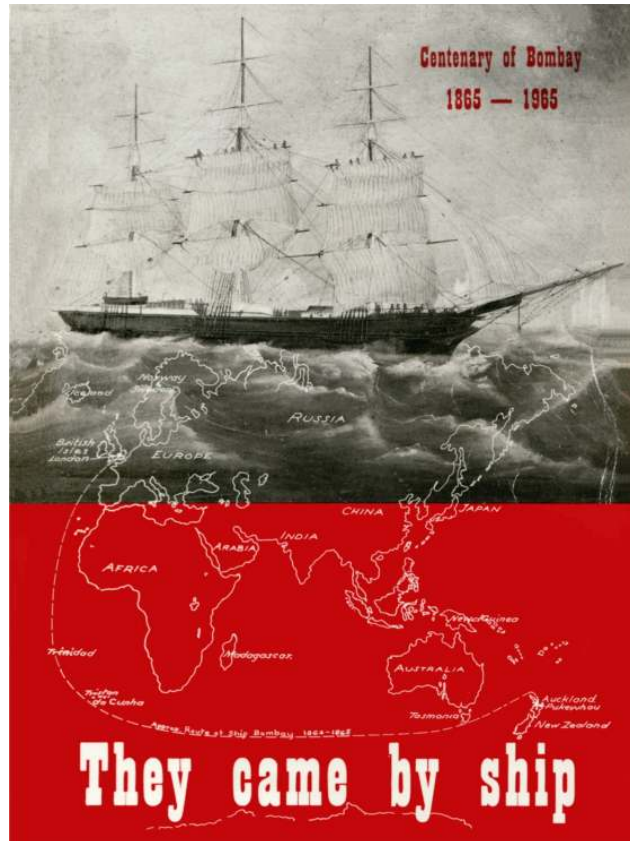


“They came by ship”
